I'm in the process of doing a timber For information on becoming a stand improvement (TSI) project on NYFOA my property. Trees cut during a TSI www.nyfoa.org, project often make good bolts for Gooding, NYFOA Popular cultivation include, sugar maple, all season from December to February. They should be stored in a shady spot and used within a month of harvesting. The bolts should be from 36" to 40" long and from 4" to 8" in diameter.

It seems to me that you should be able to get \$5.00 per log. On Facebook marketplace you will find recently inoculated logs selling from \$10 to \$55 per log. Craigslist or Facebook marketplace could be a good places to advertise your logs.

In my mind July to leaf drop is the best time for TSI projects in order to prevent the trees from resprouting. If you harvest bolts from December to February you may need to revisit the site in the future.

Bolts used for mushroom production are exempt from the 50-mile limit for moving firewood.

We hope to have a shiitake workshop in the fall of 2022.
