primary management objective for nature, who leveled a ten-acre pine plantation during an ice storm. On planted seedlings of desirable hardwood species, protected from deer by either exclosure fencing or 800 five-foot plastic tree shelters. In the hardwood stand, n a t u r a l regeneration has been protected by a series of smaller one to two-acre deer exclosures. Another recent practice is the coppicing of severelybrowsed saplings and protection of their vigorous new sprouts with tree shelters. Much of this early succession forest stand now features oak, sugar maple and black cherry saplings up to 25 feet in height. Other features of interest include extra efforts to release and protect White oak for wildlife benefits, a small planting of disease-resistant, native American Chestnuts, and a small Christmas Tree operation.

Jerry Michael hosted a woods walk on this property in 2018 for the benefit of Master Forest Owners and NYFOA members. If you have missed previous opportunities to see this property, you are encouraged to come and view regeneration practices that you may be able to implement in your own woodlot. Members of other environmental organizations with an interest in forest regeneration will also be participating. The woods walk will be held from 9:30 till 11:30 on Saturday, May 21st. The address is 3192 State Route 206, Whitney Point, NY 13862. It is 1.3 miles east from Whitney Point, on the right side of Route 206 going east, at the top of the hill. Look for signs and park along the shoulder of the road. There is no shelter or bathroom facility on the property. The woods walk will be held rain or shine, so dress accordingly. Please call (607) 648-2941 to let us know if you are coming so that we can arrange for additional parking if necessary.
