Would you like to enhance the value of your property for wildlife in the Allegheny Region? If so, Audubon New York would like to work with you.

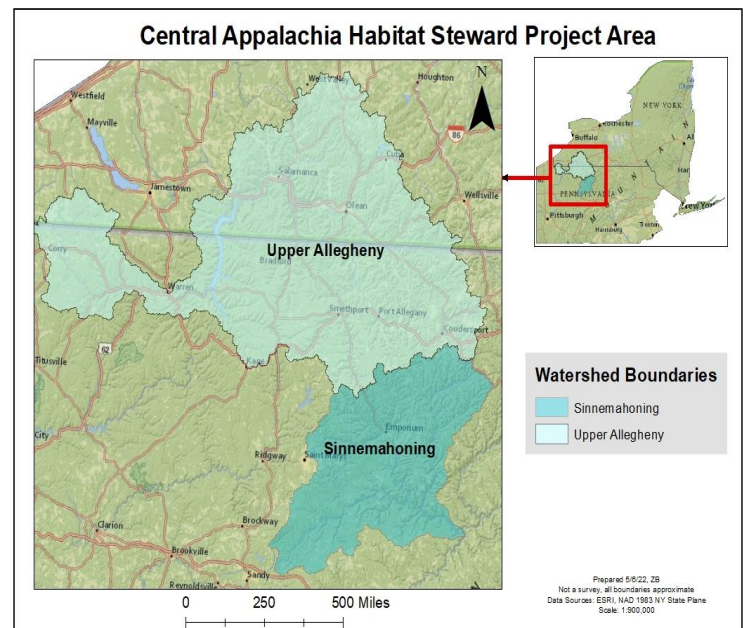
The Central Appalachia Habitat Steward Program is a collaborative effort among partners to promote management of public and private forests in the Upper Allegheny and Sinnemahoning Watersheds spanning New York and Pennsylvania.

As population trends for many forest birds decline due to loss of habitat, among other factors, the future of these forests and the benefits they provide lie in how they are managed.

By engaging with landowners like you, this project will increase habitat for American Woodcock, Ruffed Grouse, Wood Thrush, and Prairie Warbler, Cerulean Warbler and Golden-winged Warbler.

We offer **free, no obligation** services, such as informational materials and site visits from staff members. Staff members will walk your property with you and discuss goals you might have including, but not limited to, enhancing the variety of wildlife, identifying and controlling invasives and planning future forest composition.
